Definitions. In his book Form in Tonal Music, Douglass M. Green distinguishes between genre and form.He lists madrigal, motet, canzona, ricercar, and dance as examples of genres from the Renaissance period. To further clarify the meaning of genre, Green writes, "Beethoven's Op. 61 and Mendelssohn's Op. 64 are identical in genre—both are violin concertos—but different in form.

In tonal music, one tone functions as a sort of center of gravity, and the other tones in the chromatic scale are "attracted" to it in varying degrees of strength. But in atonal music, there is no gravity. You're allowed to use any of the 12 tones in the chromatic scale any way you like.
